




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Report on the list and steps taken by Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundation's Medical College & Hospital, Ahmednagar to measure attainment of specific clinical competencies by the MBBS students/interns stated in the undergraduate curriculum during the 2023 – 24.

Dr. Vithalrao Vikhe Patil Foundation's Medical College & Hospital, Ahmednagar has adopted specific clinical competencies by the MBBS students and interns as stated by the National Medical Commission of India (NMC).

- Foundation Course.
- Attitudes, Ethics and Communication.
- Early Clinical Exposure.
- Elective Posting.
- Revision of Training Learning Formats.
- Skill Acquisition and Certification.
- Self – Directed Learning.

- Subject Wise Subcompetencies :–
  - ✓ Pre – and Para Clinical Subjects.
  - ✓ Medicine and Allied (include Community Medicine).
  - ✓ Surgery and Allied.
  
- A total of 412 topics with 2949 outcomes (subcompetencies) have been identified for the entire curriculum including 20 topics and 107 outcomes for the community medicine.
  
- Assessment is based on three main criteria: knowledge, skills and competencies.

- Summative Evaluation: (Theory, Practical and Viva): As per the guidelines of the MUHS, Nashik. The goal of summative assessment is to evaluate student learning at the end of an instructional unit by comparing it against some standard or benchmark.

- Internship: - Record is maintained by the institute.
- Assessment: - Assesses the learning level of the candidate after admission throughout the terms.

- Formative Evaluation: - Each department has its own policy: - The goal of formative assessment is to monitor student learning to provide ongoing feedback that can be used by instructors to improve their teaching and by students to improve their learning.
